KOTC Celebrates Um Al-Aish LPG Filling Plant's Achievement of Environmental Certifications from the Gulf Organisation for Research and Development (GORD)



On Thursday, May 29, 2025, in the presence of the KOTC Acting CEO Sheikh Khalid Ahmed Al-Sabah, and the DCEO of Financial and Administration Affairs, Mr. Hamad Issa Al-Mishari, KOTC held a celebration to mark Um Al-Aish LPG Filling Plant's achievement of several environmental certifications from the Gulf Organisation for Research and Development (GORD). These certifications include the Net Zero Energy Certification, Energy Efficiency Certifications under the Global Sustainability Assessment System (GSAS), as well as the Energy Centre Efficiency Certification.

On this occasion, Sheikh Al-Sabah expressed his pride and honour at one of the Company's facilities receiving such prestigious recognitions. He pointed out that attaining the Net Zero Energy Certification marks the first industrial facility in the Middle East to achieve such a milestone. The plant can balance its total energy consumption with its on-site renewable energy production over the course of 12 months.

Sheikh Al-Sabah explained that the photovoltaic solar power station generates an annual amount of renewable energy that exactly matches the electricity drawn from the public grid, achieving net-zero energy consumption. He stressed that obtaining these prestigious certifications from GORD represents a major achievement for KOTC and reflects its profound commitment to environmental sustainability.

He added, "Our partnership with GORD has been of great value in achieving these objectives, and we look forward to continuing our efforts in the oil sector towards a more sustainable environmental future."

On his part, the Chairman of GORD, Dr. Yousef Al-Horr, commended the KOTC's efforts, noting that "Awarding KOTC the first Net Zero Energy Certification, alongside other sustainable building certifications, is a proud moment not only for the Company but for the entire State of Kuwait. It is an achievement that sets an ambitious benchmark for the oil sector in line with the 'New Kuwait 2035' vision." Dr. Al-Horr pointed out that the Um Al-Aish Plant earned these pioneering recognitions through its attainment of various green building certifications, including the Sustainable Operations Certificate under the GSAS system by GORD. Additionally, the Administration Building at the facility achieved the "Gold Rating", while the Social Building received the "Silver Rating" in the Sustainable Operations category under GSAS, reflecting the Company's strong commitment to operating sustainable buildings. During the ceremony, certificates and honorary shields were presented to Sheikh Khalid Ahmad Al-Sabah in the presence of the engineers from KOTC who worked on this project.


He further stressed KOTC's commitment to initiating and participating in all activities that contribute to environmental protection and community awareness.

## KOTC Acting CEO Welcomes Eid Al-Adha Well-Wishers



## KOTC Participates in the Lloyd's Register Dubai Maritime Transport Forum 2025



### The HR and Career Development Group Organises an Awareness Lecture on KPIs



On Monday, May 5, 2025, and as part of its commitment to raising awareness and educating Company employees on the latest developments in career development, the HR and Career Development Group organised an awareness lecture on performance indicators (KPIs). The lecture was held at the Company's main auditorium, with the attendance of the Manager of the HR and Career Development Group, Mr. Abdullah Al-Nafisi, alongside several company managers and personnel concerned with performance indicators.

The lecture was delivered by Dr. Tariq Al-Duwaisan, Founder and Consultant of Global Lead Consultants, who discussed KPIs, their importance, and how to effectively utilise them. Moreover, he discussed common mistakes in their application and the stages of building KPIs. Additionally, he presented a checklist that helps in analysing the quality of indicators through a set of questions designed to support those responsible for developing them.

Dr. Al-Duwaisan confirmed that KPIs have various aspects and potential pitfalls that should be avoided. He pointed out that not all aspects can be measured through KPIs, attributes such as trust and loyalty are difficult to quantify accurately because they are measured through a connected indicator. Hence, he called for caution in using KPIs and stressed the importance of selecting measurable aspects that deliver tangible impact.

In the conclusion of the lecture, a Q&A session was held where attendees engaged with the lecturer, as Mr. Al-Nafisi honoured Dr. Al-Duwaisan in appreciation of his valuable contribution.













# The First Annual Meeting on the Joint Cooperation Agreement between Kuwait University and KPC and its Subsidiaries
